PURPOSE

The Peel region's aspirational view of its future is prescribed in the *Peel Regional Investment Blueprint to 2050* (the Blueprint) (PDC2014).

In order for the Peel to achieve the change it is seeking over the next 20 to 30 years, the Peel Regional Investment Blueprint focuses on goals and strategies encompassed within five themes that are considered pivotal to the Peel's future:

1. Thriving Industry: a broadened and diversified industry base to boost the depth and breadth of jobs and occupations across the region.

2. Agriculture and Food Innovation: increased economic expansion, market base and international competitiveness of the region's agribusiness sector through innovation in production methods and renewable water and energy supplies.

3. Tourism Excellence: a network of adventures that attracts visitors and enables them to engage with the Peel's natural and built attractions in a sustainable manner.

4. Capable People: the availability of an educated and highly skilled workforce with the capacity and capability to flexibly respond to workforce requirements for the future.

5. Strong and Resilient Communities: creation of support services and infrastructure that will ensure the community is strong and resilient and able to increase its participation in, and contribution to, the future development of the Peel.

These five themes build on the basis element of the Blueprint: Driving wise use of our environment to ensure social and economic development is balanced with conservation.

The vision for the Peel as a progressive, prosperous and dynamic region with a culture of care will be realised through implementation of the Blueprint and its stated objectives, strategies and projects by all regional stakeholders.

The Peel Region Action Plan 2019-21 is designed to support the implementation of the Blueprint by:

- Prescribing key projects for the region identified from various sources (Community Strategic Plans and other stakeholder derived strategies and plans);
- Aligning these projects to Objectives and strategies in the Blueprint;
- Monitoring development and implementation of the individual projects.

Canvassing of project lead agencies has established their intent over a 3 year period to progress projects to implementation and an annual report will assess progress against this intent.

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Where there is no intended project activity by lead agencies projects will be removed from the plan. New projects will be added to the plan as lead agencies identify them.

BACKGROUND

Regional Development Australia Peel (RDA Peel) has its roles prescribed by the RDA Charter, namely:

1. Collaborate with relevant stakeholders to identify economic opportunities and leverage private and public sector investment to the regions;
2. Connect regional businesses, councils and industry sectors with international trade partners, financial markets and potential investors;
3. Promote and disseminate information on Australian Government policies and grant programs to state and local governments and industry, business and community sectors;
4. Support community stakeholders to develop project proposals to access funding;
5. Develop and maintain positive working relationships with the local government bodies in their regions;
6. Facilitate public and private sector decentralisation;
7. Assist in the delivery of Australian Government programs, where relevant and where requested by the Minister;
8. Engage with regional entrepreneurs and emerging business leaders to explore new opportunities to grow local jobs in their regions;
9. Provide information on their region's activities and competitive advantages to all levels of government, industry, business and community sectors; and
10. Provide evidence-based advice to the Australian Government on critical regional development issues positively and negatively affecting their regions.

To implement this plan, acting in line with its Charter responsibilities, RDA Peel will:

- Collaborate with stakeholders and proponents to identify economic development opportunities;
- Provide support to proponents in the planning, business planning and funding planning phases of their projects;
- Advocate to the Australian Government for investment into projects identified in this plan once business cases have been developed.

RDA Peel will maintain currency of the details of projects listed in the plan through biannual surveys of stakeholders and agencies.

Peel Development Commission (PDC), as a Statutory Authority, has its roles deigned as:

1. Be the lead coordinator in the region, for the purpose of coordinating the multiplicity of government and non-government efforts;
2. Propose economic and social growth initiatives, including through Royalties for Regions grant funding;
3. Provide information and advice to promote business development within the region;
4. Monitor regional social and economic development, including market failure, in order to identify specific agency or whole-of-government actions;
5. Plan to enable the development of a Regional Blueprint within the framework developed by the Regional Development Council, ensuring the integration of government planning, and as a resource for industry and not-for-profit organisations;
6. Lead on regional development integration of government, business, industry and community partners, through data collection, information provision, promotion, coordination and facilitation;
7. Provide regional, strategic, high-level advice and recommendations to the Regional Development Council and Minister for Regional Development;
8. Address regional policy matters referred by the Minister through the Regional Development Council.

To implement this plan, acting in line with its statutory responsibilities, PDC will:

- Collaborate with stakeholders and proponents to identify economic development opportunities;
- Facilitate support to proponents in the opportunity development, stakeholder connection, and investment attraction phases of their projects;
- Advocate to the West Australian Government for investment into projects identified in this plan once business cases have been developed.

The **Peel Regional Leaders Forum** (PRLF) was formed to provide effective leadership, and ensure the long-term triple-bottom-line sustainability of the Peel Region.

Formation of the PRLF was a bold and aspirational step for the Region, and one that came about because of a shared commitment to a stronger Region, building on our individual success.

The objectives of the PRLF are:

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1. Reinforce, promote and enhance the identity, regional boundary of Peel, ensuring its retention as a region.
2. Facilitate the economic development, ecological integrity and social well being to benefit the people and environment of the Peel Region.
3. Encourage collaboration internally and externally to develop and implement mutually and regionally beneficial projects.

The PRLF will:

- Advocate for Priority Initiatives and Projects;
- Advocate for the resolution of regional issues;
- Support other initiatives and projects;
- Practice good governance.

To implement this plan, acting in line with its statutory responsibilities, PRLF will:

- Collaborate with stakeholders and proponents to identify economic, environmental and social development opportunities;
- Identify their priority projects for advocacy through a transparent and equitable assessment process;
- Advocate to all levels of Government for investment into priority projects identified in this plan.

This in turn will provide farmers and land managers with vital data that enables them to reduce their nutrient discharges and carbon emissions, regenerate their lands and increase their agricultural productivity.
